1. Tips for using the RSS-Feeds

A program which can process the RSS format 2.0 is necessary for the use of RSS through the EEX.

The following browsers have their own built-in RSS support:

- *Microsoft Internet Explorer 7*
for every XP and Vista based Microsoft Windows operating system
- *Mozilla Firefox*
a free web browser, available for almost all modern operating systems
- *Opera*
a free web browser, available for several operating systems
- *Safari*
a web browser for MacOS X of Apple computer

1.1. Microsoft Internet Explorer 7

[Microsoft Internet Explorer](#) (referred to as MSIE below) has had its own built-in RSS reader since version 7.

To subscribe to the RSS-Feed of the EEX, click on the orange RSS symbol which is indicated in the menu strip and then select the feed which you would like to subscribe to.

Then the RSS-Feed is opened and shown in the current browser window. To subscribe to the Feed, click on "subscribe feed" at the beginning of the RSS-Feed.

To register feeds or to administer them, click in the favorite list on the button for feeds. The MSIE indicates all subscribed RSS-Feeds which you can choose by mouse click.

1.2. Microsoft Internet Explorer 6

The MSIE up to version 6.x and Microsoft Outlook Express offer no RSS support, nevertheless, these can be upgraded by installing of additional programs.

1.3. Mozilla Firefox

[Mozilla Firefox](#) recognises whether a web page offers a RSS-Feed.

To subscribe the RSS-Feed of the EEX, click on the orange RSS symbol which is indicated on the right edge of the address field and then select the Feed which you would like to subscribe to.

In Firefox up to version 1.5, the dialog "add dynamic bookmark" will appear. Firefox organises RSS-Feeds as a folder and each of the bookmarks located in it represents a message. Above the

field "create in" you can determine where Firefox should file the RSS-Feed within the bookmark structure. Confirm the subscription with "OK".

Since version 2 of Firefox, the RSS-Feed will initially appear on the current page of the browser. Using the button "Subscribe this Feed with" you can select a program with which the dynamic bookmark should be processed. Alternatively you can add the Feed to the Firefox bookmarks using the button "Subscribe now".

If you want to subscribe a larger number of feeds, it is advisable to use one of the available [extensions](#).

1.4. Opera

Current versions of the [Opera-Browsers](#) automatically recognise whether a web page offers a RSS-Feed.

To subscribe the RSS-Feed of the EEX, click on the blue RSS symbol which is shown beside the address in the address strip. A new dialog is indicated. Confirm the subscription with "Yes". Afterwards, you can access the Feed by selecting the menu strip "Feeds" and then the feed of the EEX.

With older versions, the Feed has to be subscribed to in the e-mail part of the browser.

Those who prefer not to use a browser for reading the RSS-Feed, can also use internet-readers and software-readers.

1.5. Internet-Reader

There are several suppliers who offer the reading of RSS-Feeds directly on the internet.

These services are offered free of charge from [Bloglines](#), [Google Reader](#), [Rojo](#) and [Newsgator](#).

1.6. Software-Reader

It is also possible to install one's own RSS reader on the PC.

There are free versions available from [Feedreader](#) and [RSSOwl](#).

This is recommended for users who have subscribed to several RSS-Feeds.
